

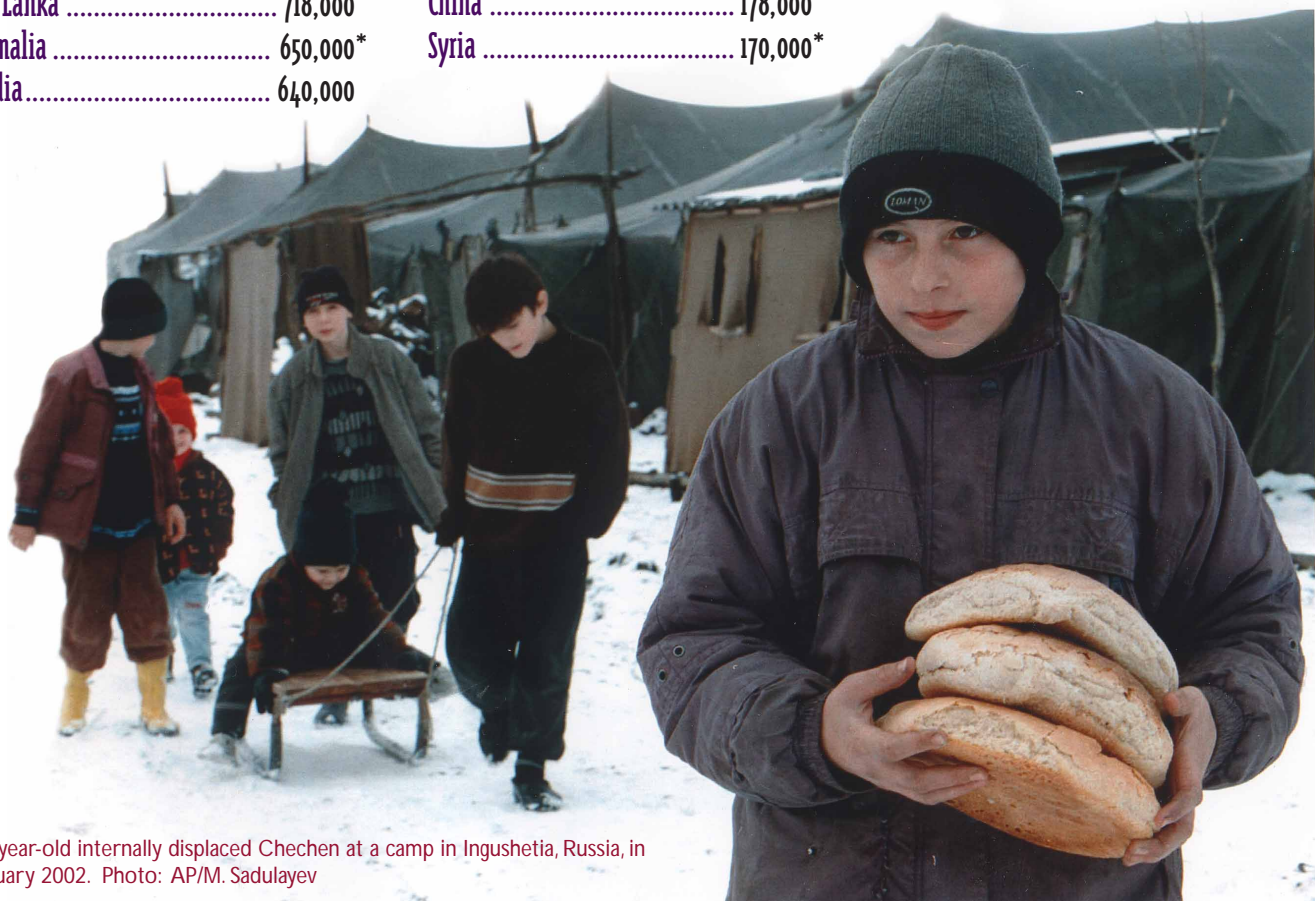

This table identifies countries in which large numbers of civilians have been internally displaced and/or from which they have fled to become refugees or asylum seekers. This table is derived primarily from tables 5 and 6. Estimates of the numbers of uprooted persons are often fragmentary. Uprooted populations below 50,000 do not appear below.
